(If there are first-time guests, begin with a round of introduction and warmly welcome the new visitors.)


Suggested icebreakers:

Scripture Passage: John 3:16-17 (NIV) Sermon Title: Good Things Must Share

<u>Introduction</u>

When we experience good things, it is natural for us to share them with others. Similarly, as believers, it should be natural for us to share the blessing of the gospel of salvation with those who are lost. The word "Gospel" means good news.

Two reasons why we need to share the good news of salvation:

- 1. We can be set free from sin and destruction.
- 2. We can be set apart for a purpose and destiny.

Discovery and Understanding Questions:

Q1. What does salvation mean, and why do we need it?

A1: Salvation means being saved from harm, ruin, or loss. Biblically, it refers to being rescued from sin, which leads to destruction. Jesus Christ came into the world to bring salvation by dying on the cross, setting us free from sin and its consequences.

Q2. How does the gospel set us apart for a purpose and destiny?

A2. God creates everything for a purpose and destiny. Ephesians 2:10 (NLT) states that "For we are God's masterpiece. He has created us anew in Christ Jesus, so we can do the good things he planned for us long ago." As His masterpiece, we are designed for a purpose and destiny. Although sin marred this, Jesus' death and resurrection restored us, enabling us to fulfil God's original plan.

Application Questions

Break into smaller groups, share, pray and minister to one another.

- Q1. Good things are meant to be shared—so why aren't Christians sharing the Good News?
- Q2. How do you plan to share the gospel in the coming week, and with whom?

WORKS (15 minutes)

Focus on edification, equipping and evangelism.
